He has also participated in many prestigious tournaments such as the Argentine Open, U.S. Open, The Hurlingham Open, Hall of Fame Cup and many more

He has competed and won many major NZ tournaments, including the NZ Open on four occasions; the Saville Cup on three occasions; and Captained the 'Runner-Up' FIP team in the Zone Finals of the World Cup played in NZ in 2007. He has played in South Africa, Kenya, Zambia, England, Holland, Australia, Barbados, Singapore, Malaysia and has worked for a number of years in Australia for John Fitzgerald. Craig has a Bachelor of Arts Degree, majoring in English, Film and T.V and also played half-back for the Waikato NPC in 1995. However, he lists his most important achievement as being a proud father to nine year old, Jack.
